Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **EKTA**, **MADURAI** which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31 March 2025 & the Statement of Income and Expenditure for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements
